

WHY DO WE NEED THIS DOCUMENT AND AN ASB REPORTING PROCESS?

1. To tackle the growing level of ASB and criminal behaviour in Friars Cliff, we need the ongoing support and presence of Police at key times
2. We will only get that presence allocated to Friars Cliff, if the area is considered as an 'area of interest' at Dorset Police HQ
3. This will only happen if there are a number of genuine ASB incidents reported, by a range of our residents. **No reporting = no help.**

What have you experienced?

AN EMERGENCY

A serious injury, immediate life-threatening danger, risk to public safety, fire or crime in progress.

CALL: 999

Ask for the Police, Fire, Ambulance or Coastguard. Be ready with the location, postcode & description of the emergency.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB)

Refer to the **shaded** guide (top right of this page) to see what is considered genuine Anti-Social Behaviour by the Police.

CALL: 101

If the incident is still happening, you should try to call 101. Be ready with the location, postcode & description of activity.



A VEHICLE DRIVEN ILLEGALLY

Registered vehicles only. e-scooters/bikes are ASB.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

You will first have to answer the below 7 questions, *exactly as shown*, to reach the actual 101 form.

Q1: Is anyone injured, is there immediate danger or risk to public safety? **A: NO**

Q2: Is property being damaged right now? **A: NO**

Q3: Did this happen on a train or railway station? **A: NO**

Q4: Where did this happen? **A: ADD THE POSTCODE**
Scroll down past map (or adjust it) then click **YES**

Q5: What is it about? **A: NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA..**

Q6: What is it about? **A: SOMEONE'S BEHAVIOUR..**

Q7: What do you want to report? **A: SOMEONE CAUSING A PUBLIC DISTURBANCE**

NOW you can start the process of completing the 101 form. Send your incident number to FCRA

e.g The most common areas are:
The field/woods, café and toilets: BH23 4EP
Steamer Point Car Park: BH23 4TA

WHAT IS ASB? THE POLICE VIEW:

- Rowdy, inconsiderate behaviour
- Noise: Shouting, Swearing, Loud Music
- Unplanned parties in a public space
- Street drinking & drugs leading to ASB
- Drug dealing
- Being Threatening, aggressive & Intimidating
- Littering, inc. drug paraphernalia
- Urinating in public
- Vehicle nuisance: street cruising, being on non-road areas, mis-use of e-bikes & scooters

CAN YOU RECORD OR PHOTOGRAPH PEOPLE BEING ANTI-SOCIAL, inc. MINORS?

Yes – if you believe someone (of any age) is committing a crime or is behaving anti-socially, you are allowed to record them. But you must not share it socially, only hand it to the Police.

Please DO NOT tackle ASB without support, use 101 instead, where it will be recorded properly

GOOD TO KNOW:

You can go to the online 101 form using the process shown to the left anytime, to record recent and multiple ASB episodes. All recordings help the FCRA build a better picture and evidence of ASB for Police.
